




Opening Day Activities

On January 30, SMWYC threw a Super Bowl Regatta and over forty boats showed up. It didn't rain, most of the time and we had five fleets racing. We had ten Optimist (a type of boat, not a philosophy) joining in the fun. These new boats seem to be taking over for the sabot fleet that has been shrinking in the past several years and the manufacturer has stopped producing them. The this new fleet is active at one large yacht club in the marina and the other large yacht club has decided to use them in their Jr. Program this year. We can expect to see these boats a lot in the near future.

With forty-two competitors, the Sail Committee was stretched pretty thin, but we pulled it off. There was a bit of a problem in scoring, but we did get the results out and some of them had to be done by hand. **Larry Kolisnyk** was driving the primary chase boat with **Fleet Captain Themis Glatman** borrowing the junior's inflatable and running around helping on the water. On the Committee dock was **Steve Potter** (*Event Chair*), **Matt Clark**, **Sharon Taylor** and three volunteers from the Lido Fleet. They had their hands full putting on four races in their foul weather gear. **Joe Cowen**, our new Racing Member (who bought *Yassoo*), and I did the scoring with a new system we were trying out. Before Joe and I get ragged on too much about the scoring, I would like to point out that it is hard to keep track of boats that don't know their sail numbers, let friends borrow sails without changing the numbers and the computers that think they know what boat is racing when you type a person's name in; does slow things down. **Note:** Don't argue with a computer; it doesn't give a darn, it can sit there longer than you can and the results will be the same. You must lie. So John Smith is not going to race, but John Smith2 is. If this makes sense to you, we need your help with scoring.
