


SANTA MONICA WINDJAMMERS YACHT CLUB September 21st, 2015 - September 27th, 2015

We decided to use this break in the Wednesday night races to introduce members to boats the club owns which are available to members...**SMWYC's Small Boat Fleet!**

So far there are only a dozen SMWYC members checked out so we'd like to invite anyone interested to come to the club between 3 and 5 Wednesday, September 23rd to learn which boats are available and how to use the hoist and boats.

The **Cal 20** has been used as a training boat for those wanting to learn to sail. Steve Potter and his instructors feel it is the most forgiving boat...mistakes can be made without serious results. This boat, donated by Jim Wright, could be taken to Catalina (by an adventurous couple and with proper certification) and has been the most regularly used of the fleet.

The two **Capri 22's** were built by Catalina to be small, quick, race boats; and they are a joy to drive by an experienced sailor. Both are rigged to race although only one has a spinnaker so far. These are not difficult boats, just VERY RESPONSIVE. One is usually kept in the water, the other on a trailer.

I would love to see our members hone their skills with these two Capri's so they could enter them in the **final BBQ race this Sunday, Sept. 27th.**

There is also a **Hobie 16**, which was donated but has not been used! Having owned a **Prindle 16**, I would like to rig the boat Wednesday and see if any members are willing to take a "wet ride" on a fast boat.

There are a variety of smaller boats which we can go over, but we are not planning to launch unless by special request.

We plan to start setting up boats between 3 and 5, demonstrate the lift, and do a short sail between 5:30 and 7:00.

We are ordering in pizza and salad for 7:30 to 8:30, so even if you can't sail with us, you can share a dinner for under \$10!
